Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation Show Review

Saturday, February 9th was the date for this year's JDRF show under the direction of Steve Finkelstein. The JDRF is a national event that is held here in St. Louis once a year which draws a crowd of over one thousand attendees. The primary function of this event is to provide continuing education to the parents of juveniles who suffer from diabetes.

On hand this year was performers Ted Schnarre, Steve Zuehlke, Don and Barb Burgan, Larry Skorepa, Steve Finkelstein, Tim Shegitz and Joe Fingerhut. Steve Zuehlke, Don, Barb, and Larry took care of entertaining the younger kids (ages 3-7) while the rest of the guys handled the older kids. With the younger set, Steve Zuehlke got the kids warmed up with the Pop Away Wand, a few disappearing balloons and produced a Teddy Bear, which was given to a volunteer. Don and Barb Burgan opened with the Flag of All Nations, a VISABLE coloring effect, the SPOT CAN and a nice Topsy Turvy Bottle effect. Larry closed the set with a Paper Hat Tear, a nice cut and restored (that he learned at the recent teach-in compliments of Ted Schnarre's excellent instructions. a nice routine using Jumbo wands and ended with the production of a LIVE Rabbit. happened to many


of the Kirkwood residents, Ring 1 decided to use the show to help raise funds for the families of those who lost their life. We were very successful!








members


