Ring Report

The Midwest Magic Jubilee was held during the weekend of Labor Day. This year marked its 62nd year anniversary. IBM Ring 1 and S.A.M. Assembly 8 co-chair this yearly event. It was held at the Renaissance St Louis Airport Hotel. The following performed and/or lectured: Michael Finney, Bill Gladwell, Howard Mincone, David McCreary, Duane Laflin, Hide Kimoto, T. J. Regul, Johnny Harper (Ring 1's President), Terry Richison, and Josh Roth. The Friday night show was free for all Veterans and First Responders (and their families). Michael Finney is the newly elected President of the International Brotherhood of Magicians. He was the MC for the Saturday night show and had the entire audience laughing. He also provided a lecture for the attendees. He shared events in his life that led to his career as a magician. The attendees really enjoyed this lecture. Bill Gladwell performed a mentalist act on Sunday night. He also lectured and shared some of his effects. The attendees enjoyed hearing how he ended up becoming a hypnotist, magician, mentalist, etc. David McCreary truly entertained the audience during the Saturday night show. He is an expert entertainer who appeals to all ages—from children to seniors. Duane Laflin performed his full illusion show during the Sunday night show. It was amazing to see all the illusions he brought. He is based in Branson, MO but travels throughout the United States. He brings assistants who assist him and, also, they change outfits continuously throughout the show. It is advertised as "A Grand Magical Entertainment Experience!" The audience gave them a lengthy standing ovation after the performance. Howard Mincone entertained the audience with his routine. He is an exceptional juggler but also includes comic movement, mime, and stand-up comedy in his performance. T. J. Regul is known as the Quad City Magician. He combined comedy and magic in his performance. He specializes in child and family entertainment. Hide Kimoto probably traveled the farthest since he lives in Tokyo, Japan. He is one of Japan's finest coin magicians. He shared that he learned coin magic from Shigeo Futagawa. Terry Richison, Johnny Harper, and Josh Roth have all served as presidents of Ring 1. They are all talented magicians/entertainers and the audience thoroughly enjoyed their performances.

The Ring is looking forward to the combined IBM Ring 1 and S.A.M. Assembly 8 President's Banquet on September 28th. Max Krause is scheduled as the featured entertainer. The members are looking forward to his performance.

Johnny Harper volunteered to lead Magic 101 at the September meeting. Members come at 6:30 before the regular meeting which starts at 7:00. Members volunteer to teach other members "easy" effects which they learn and can perform that night. First, Johnny had members cut cards, so they could perform "linking cards." Then he taught a dollar bill restoration effect. He convinced the members that he tore out of piece of a dollar bill. However, when he opened the bill it was intact. Next, he had members pick a card and amazingly the name of the card was actually engraved in his wedding band. John Davit, who has been involved with magic for 58 years performed several of his favorite card tricks.
